In accordance with Note 4 to the accounts stocks of World Mathematicians Directories have not been evaluated for accounts purposes.

In our opinion, subject to the foregoing comments regarding the World Directory of Mathematicians, for which the Union expensed in 1982 \$ 20 516 (see note 8), the balance sheet and the income and expenditure accounts set out on page 2 to 3 together with the notes attached thereto give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the INTERNATIONAL MATHEMATICAL UNION at December 31, 1982.

Notes to be read in connection with the financial statements

Principal accounting principles:

1. CURRENCY

The financial statements are expressed in US dollars. Balances in other currencies have been translated into US dollars by applying the UNESCO standard rates of exchange as at December 31, 1982.

Income and expenditure for the year was translated at the rates applying at the date of payment, except for transactions in connection with the World Directory of Mathematicians which were translated at the UNESCO average rate for 1982.

These standard rates closely follow quoted market rates.

2. INCOME

Contributions and grants have been recorded on a cash basis as in previous years. That is to say only contributions actually received during the year have been taken as income. Therefore, no account has been taken of contributions due but not received by December 31, 1982.

3. EXPENDITURE

Expenditure is recorded on an accruals basis. That is to say all expenses incurred during the year have been included in the accounts whether paid or not.

4. STOCK OF MATHEMATICIANS DIRECTORIES

As in previous years no account has been taken in these accounts for the stock of directories in existence at December 31, 1982.
